

poles to be set along a line not more than six feet east of the east line of the Michigan Central railroad right of way from its present power plant north to Main Street. Also to set a second line not more than twenty feet in any direction from the line already constructed from Pennsylvania Avenue along the Grand Trunk right of way and Cedar River to the Commonwealth Power Company's property. The second party agrees to re-set upon thirty days written notice from the party of the first part, his heirs or assigns, any pole or poles which may be set on the first party's land so as not to interfere with any improvement which may be made upon said land. Together with the right to enter upon said premises for the purpose of erecting such poles and supports and stringing said wires and repairing or renewing the same and the right to turn or remove such trees as interfere with said line.

Second party to pay first party twenty-five (\$25.00)
dollars for each tower set, to be paid before any work is
done on said land. If said towers are not set and line
constructed within one year from date, then this in-
strument to be null and void.

Together with the right to enter upon said premises
for the purpose of erecting such towers and supports and
stringing said wires and repairing or renewing the
same, and the right to turn or remove such trees as
interfere with said line.
